

Perth Birds and Bush Northern Wetlands, Wildflowers & Wildlife Nature Tour

Enjoy a half day experiencing Perth's wetlands, wildflowers and wildlife! We will visit Reabold Hill for the magnificent views of Perth and to look at wildflowers, visit tranquil Lake Joondalup in Yellagonga Regional Park, visit a floristically diverse Banksia Woodland, enjoy the rocky rapids of the Swan River in Walyunga National Park and we will come back to Perth through Whiteman Park. We will see wild Australian animals like Western Grey Kangaroos, lizards, parrots, Black Swans and cockatoos.

The tour can be modified to better meet your own interests.

Group Size: These are private tours for 1 to 4 people. There is no chance the tour will be cancelled as the minimum number will always be reached!

Pick-up and Drop-off Locations:

Perth and surrounding suburbs.

Tour Times:

Morning tour: 7:30 am to 12:30 pm

Afternoon tour: 12:30 pm and return 5:30 pm

Pricing

Half day tour (approximately 5 hours): 1 person \$220 with additional people \$70 each.

Infants and children under 7 must be in baby or booster seat - passengers to provide their own.

Inclusions:

- Morning or afternoon tea,
- Pick up and drop off at your accommodation in Perth and surrounding suburbs,
- Experienced guide who is knowledgeable of native wildflowers and wildlife,
- Air-conditioned vehicle, and
- Entry fees into Walyunga National Park.

Availability

Available all year but the Wildflowers and Swan River flows are best in August to December.

Highlights

Reabold Hill

We will take a short walk up Reabold Hill to take in the stunning views of Perth and the coast. This is in the 437 hectare Bold Park reserve which has over 300 species of wildflowers! There is a raised boardwalk to the highest natural lookout point on the Swan Coastal Plain in the Perth area.

Lake Joondalup Neil Hawkins Park picnic area

Joondalup Lake Reserve is 13 kilometres long and surrounds one of the biggest lakes in Perth. The endangered Carnaby's Black-Cockatoo nests near here and can often be seen in the area. We can take a 600 meter walk to the scenic lookout over the lake. It is an important place for local Nyoongar people and the word Joondalup means Place of whiteness or glistening water.

Banksia Woodland

We visit a near pristine and floristically diverse Banksia Woodland. Banksia Woodlands on the Swan Coastal Plain are listed as an endangered Threatened Ecological Community. There are often Western Grey Kangaroos seen in this area.

Walyunga National Park

Walyunga National Park is a Wandoo and Marri woodland at the foot of the Darling. The Swan River runs through the park and is a picturesque series of rocky rapids and pools. There are often Western Grey Kangaroos and many birds and reptiles here.

Whiteman Park

The tour returns to Perth via Whiteman Park. Western Grey Kangaroos are often seen here!

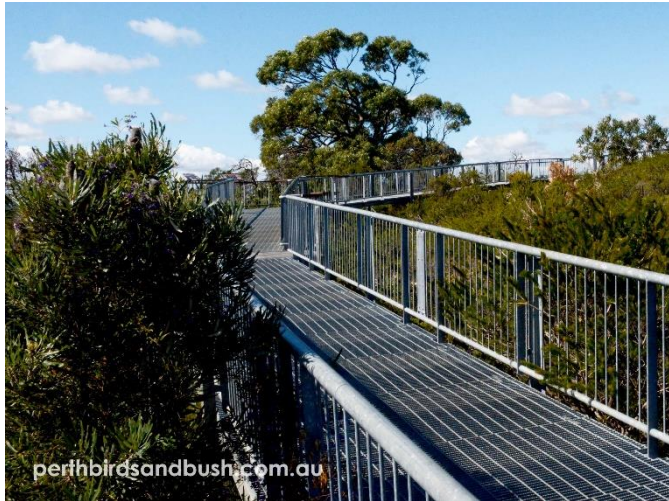
